YOUR TOUR ITINERARY

We start our day with a comfortable express train journey to London. On arrival we enjoy a guided tour of the city's famous sights including Buckingham Palace, St James' Palace, Trafalgar Square, Nelson's Column, Big Ben, 10 Downing Street, the Houses of Parliament, Westminster Abbey, the Nelson Mandela Statue & the London Eye, the world's largest ferris wheel.

We also see the changing of the Guard ceremony and have free time for lunch and shopping in London's West End...see Covent Garden, Piccadilly Circus & Leicester Square. After lunch we have time to visit the National Art Gallery or the British Museum (admissions free). We continue to the River Thames where

we have the option to take a 40 minute open top boat cruise on the Thames for spectacular views of... St Paul's Cathedral, Shakespeare's Globe Theatre, the Millennium Bridge, Tower of London, Tower Bridge and much more.

In the afternoon we are invited to visit Madame Tussauds, London's most popular tourist attraction, and mix with the world's most famous people. We can also take a ride on the world famous London Eye for spectacular views of London's skyline. Alternatively we can visit fashionable Camden Town or Notting Hill home to London's best markets – great for souvenirs!

YOUR TOUR ITINERARY

In the morning we visit Windsor where 900 years of Royal history are waiting for you. Our experienced guide will accompany you on a walking tour of Windsor where we see what is now the largest continuously occupied castle in the world. If the Royal flag is flying, the Queen's at home. We have the opportunity to explore the magnificent state apartments and see how the royalty live. St George's chapel is one of England's most beautiful ecclesiastical buildings, and also the burial place of many kings and queens. We also take a walk over the River Thames to historic Eton, home to Britain's most famous public school, where 18 former British prime ministers once studied.

We visit Christ Church, the grandest and most popular of all its Colleges. Founded nearly 500 years ago it has educated many big names, was used for scenes in the Harry Potter films, and is home to the smallest cathedral in the country.

In the afternoon we have a walking tour of Oxford, the oldest university city in England. The university is spread across the town centre among 39 separate colleges ranging in age from 50 to over 600 years.

We visit Christ Church, the grandest and most popular of all its Colleges. Founded nearly 500 years ago it has educated many big names, was used for scenes in the Harry Potter films, and is home to the smallest cathedral in the country.

During the tour we'll hear stories about Oxford's famous students like Bill Clinton and Lewis Carroll, and get a feel for what student life must be like. Of course no visit would be complete without a hat, tie or t-shirt from the High Street.

Cambridge & Greenwich including tour of Cambridge University

YOUR TOUR ITINERARY

Quaint and village-like Greenwich is a delightful place to spend the morning. We visit the top of the hill in London's oldest Royal park - here we are offered a stunning panoramic view of London... we discover the history and significance of the Royal Observatory, the Meridian Line and Greenwich Mean Time. At the bottom of the hill next to the River Thames we see the Cutty Sark, which built in 1869, was the fastest sailing ship of her day - and also see England's tallest building. We have free time to enjoy the famous market and Greenwich's other attractions.

We continue our journey to Cambridge, where our tour leader takes us on a walking tour of this charming market town which boasts an extraordinary

combination of rural tranquillity and architectural splendour. You discover why Cambridge is famed for the excellence of its university. We visit Trinity College, the largest in Cambridge. It was here that Isaac Newton, inspired by a falling apple, formulated the law of gravity.

We visit the Fitzwilliam museum one of the oldest and most important in England. Here we can enjoy fine works of art by Cezanne and Picasso amongst others. You also have the opportunity to visit King's College Chapel a 'must see' for any visitor to England. Superb woodwork and stained glass windows combine with the stonework to form an architectural miracle. After you have time to shop at the Saturday market, or go punting on the River Cam.

Stonehenge & Bath including audio tour of Stonehenge

YOUR TOUR ITINERARY

In the morning we visit one of the most famous prehistoric monuments in the world - a 'must see' during any stay in Britain. With more than 5000 years of history, Stonehenge remains one of the world's great unsolved mysteries. The monument endures as a source of inspiration and fascination and, for many, a place of worship and celebration. An audio tour will accompany our walk around the stones.

Stonehenge now has a transformed visitor experience, with a new world class visitor centre, housing permanent and temporary exhibitions, plus a spacious shop and cafe. At the stone circle a sense of context and dignity is returned to the monument; Stonehenge now reunited with it's

ancient approach, the Avenue, and the surrounding landscape open for exploration.

In the afternoon we take the scenic drive to Bath. With over 2000 years of history, and elegant honey-coloured Georgian houses, no other city can rival its breathtaking architecture. We see the Royal Crescent, the Circus, Assembly Rooms, and delightful Pulteney Bridge. We also learn how the Romans arrived in Bath in the 1st Century, discovered Britain's only existing hot water springs, and built a bathing complex. It now stands as Britain's greatest memorial to the Roman era.
